Claiming God's Promises in prayer



“God’s promises to us are intended not as sedatives, but as stimulants!”

The normal pattern of believing prayer is simply this:

What God has promised us – what God has authorised us to have – we should ask for in prayer.

We need to learn to take God’s promises and turn them into prayers.

Take James 1:5 as an example:

We are assured that if we lack wisdom to know how to respond to and act in our trials, we should ask God for wisdom - and the giving God will give it to us.
